Dear Falke:

I'm not going to town today, I have so many letters to write that I doubt that I will have time. It's still hotter than the devil down here and there doesn't seem to be any let-up in sight. There is talk of lengthening our basic training to 16 week instead of 12. I only hope they don't, but if they do I guess there isn't much one can do about it.

I've had a sore foot the last 3 days so this morning I had it lanced. It was a callous which had become infected on the bottom of my foot and this marching ~~almost~~ didn't help it any. One of the

the trainees in our company was a foot specialist before he was drafted so he fixed it for me this morning for 45 cents. It feels much better now so I imagine it will be O.K.

I have a question to ask you and 'Dad'. Would you rather I try to go back to school or try to go to Officer's Training. I have to make up my mind pretty soon and I would like to know what you would rather I do. If I go to school they think that I would have to stay 5 years after the war is over. There are about 70 boys in our company eligible for Army Specialized Training and some of them, like me, aren't sure whether they want to stay in the Army 5 years or not.

I would like to go to school and I would like to be an officer too. I can't do both so I have to decide within the next week or two.

To go to O.C.S. one has to complete basic training with a recommendation.

from the commanding officer. I would also have to be interviewed 5 different times by different high ranking officers.

If they thought that I had had the qualifications and was capable of being an officer, I would then go one month to Officer's Candidate Preparatory School. If I got through that I would then go four months to O.C.S and, providing I passed, would graduate a 2nd Lieutenant in the Medical Administration Corp. It's a long tough course, but it may be worth it. I would finish the course about April 1. I would really like to be an officer; but then again I would like to go onto school.

I'll write you more about the school deal when you find out more about it. What do you and Dad think I should do?

I went to church this morning, it was really pretty nice and I'm going to go every Sunday from now on. Kenny's going with me next
