He fell for Mary's year old daughter-I guess they are never too old or too young for him.He said Beverly, the baby, had enormous blue eyes and such chubby ,rosy cheeks.He came back to Roberts rather late in the evening as he met another charmer on the bus and as he said he debussed at her destination and had a wonderful evening.He does not know just what the next move is to be.He asks every letter that I keep him informed as to how you are.I write him 3 times a week if not more often.

they managed to tie to their boat,as I understood
it,were out 30 hours before they managed to contact
the ship by radio.They got back in time to wear out
