I regret the difficulty which you are having in your job search, and know that this is a problem. I receive many letters--from Individuals with and without handicaps--who are unable to find employment opportunities. Because I do not operate any type of job bank, it is only by chance if I hear of openings.

I would suggest to you that perhaps your local office of Social Rehabilitation Services may be of some assistance to you in providing information on training or employment.
