The invitations were sent "in good faith" to members of both parties, he said, because it's not very often someone from Kansas runs for president. Dole hasn't made a decision about

running for re-election to the Senate, but he said it is likely he'll "be prepared to make a statement" about what he wants to do by the end of next March. By that time several state primaries will be over and "whosever running will know quickly who's going to be in it for the dura-tion," the senator said.

"It seems to far off to make the Senate decision.

However, he added, "It's important to carry out my Senate duties. I don't intend to be an absentee senator. I will take care of the interests of Kansas." Dole hasn't missed a vote in the Senate this year, but said he might miss his first vote Monday.

He realizes he is risking his Senate seat by running for president, but, he noted, "You always run a risk. If I didn't do anything and just announced for Senate there's a

The senator is fairly confident he will be in the presidential race "for the duration.

Right now he counts himself among the four top Republican candidates, including fomer California Governor Ronald Reagan, former Treasury Secretary Connally and Senate Minority leader Howard Baker, R-Tenn., in that order. Dole believes he and Baker are tied for third.
