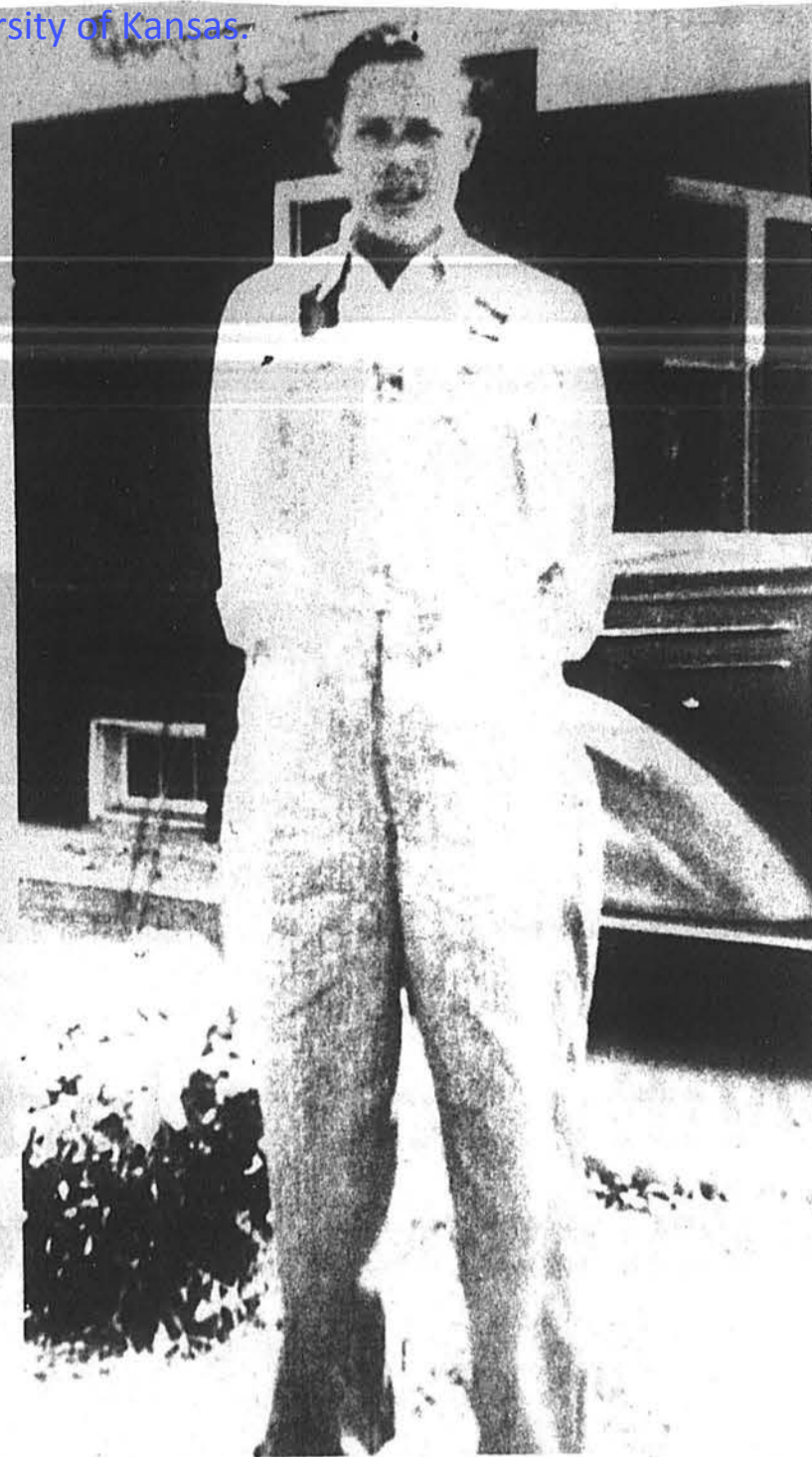

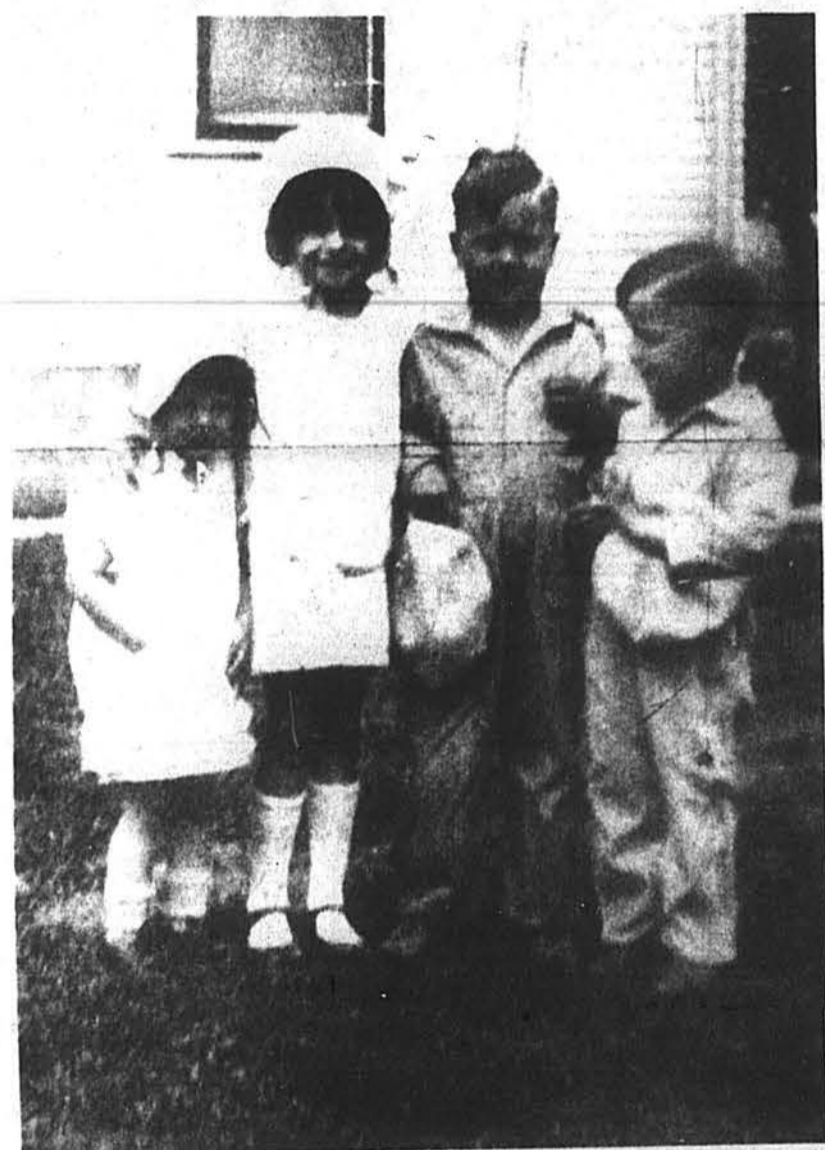

who has lived in Hays for years, was director many years of the Fort Hays State University Alumni Association, retiring in January of this year. Colvin was news editor of the school newspaper, The Pony Express. Helen Hoard was associate editor, Esther Altland was feature editor and Dole was sports editor. Reporters were Mullenax, Osborne, Pearson, Reisig, Peggy Lee Beck, Carson, Embree, Smith and Margheim. The newspaper that year won first class honor rating in the National Scholastic Press Association.
