McDill "Huck" Boyd, Republican District Chairman, today urged voters not be swayed by anything "new or nasty brought up in the closing stages of a political campaign.

"Charges held back until the last week are usually gutter politics," he continued, "and are not released until the last minute because they cannot stand the light of day."

Boyd said the basic issues are developed early "and late charges are made by losers in a desperate effort to salvage victory at any cost.

"The defacement of signs, last minute visits from unidentified callers, unfounded charges qualified by the phrase 'it is reported' are evidence of desperation and usually signal the swan song of losers.

"The candidate who permits his supporters to make smear charges against his opponent is obviously not the type of man to be a good public servant, and does not deserve the support he asks at the polls," Boyd continued.
