WASHINGTON-Rep. Bob Dole announced that he has been appointed to membership on the House Committee on Government Operations.

Duties of the committee are varied, but Dole explained that it has jurisdiction over nearly every federal agency, many of which play an important role in Western Kansas. The First District Congressman, the only Republican from the Midwest on the committee, fills the vacancy created by the late Clarence J. Brown, Ohio, who, at the time of his death, was ranking Republican member.

The Committee receives and examines reports of the Comptroller General of the United States and submits such recommendations to the House as it deems necessary or desirable in connection with the subject matter of these reports. Members of the Committee study the operation of Government activities at all levels to determine its economy and efficiency. Effects of laws enacted to reorganize the legislative and executive branches of the Government are evaluated by the Committee which also studies intergovernmental relationships between the U. S. and the States and municipalities, and between the U. S. and international organizations of which the U. S. is a member.

Dole, who will retain membership on the House Committee on Agriculture, said he has requested assignment to the following sub-committees on his new committee: Military Operations; Intergovernmental Relations, and Research and Technical Programs.
