Congressman Bob Dole (R-Kans), a member of the United States Air Force Academy Board of Visitors will make an official visit to the Academy this Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.

Dole stated that each service academy has a Board of Visitors pursuant to an Act of Congress approved June 29, 1948. According to law, the Board of Visitors must visit the academy to which it is assigned each year (but may do so more than once each year) inquiring into all aspects of academy life; e.g., students, faculty, physical facilities, administration, fiscal matters, and policy, student morale, discipline, quality of instruction, or any other matters relating to the academy which the Board of Visitors feels it wishes to investigate. The law requires the Board of Visitors to make a written report to the President of the United States within 60 days following the conclusion of its visit.

The Air Force Academy Board of Visitors is composed of 15 members, including the Chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, the Chairman of the House Armed Services Committee, 3 [REDACTED] U. S. Senators appointed by the Vice President, and four House Members appointed by the Speaker of the House. The other six members -- not members of Congress -- are appointed by the President.
