Congressman Bob Dole told Republican women attending the 14th Annual Women's Conference in Washington, D. C., that there is no substitute for effective political organization in winning elections. Slogans, advertising, speakers, rallies, workshops, or anything else is relatively meaningless without organization. Many who survived the 1964 debacle must credit solid organization for their presence in the 89th Congress.

If we are to perpetuate a thinking and responsible Republican vote for the mid-term election in 1966, the voters must understand the current political issues -- understand that Democratic majorities are steam-rolling the Administration's programs. While Johnson talks of bipartisanship to get all his programs passed in the spirit of consensus, he's working full time to bury the Republican Party. We must, then, bring new people into the party-----organize-----work-----organize----- work-----and make the needed gains in 1966.

Approximately 60 Kansas Republican women are attending the Conference and some 3500 are here from every part of the country. The Kansans present include Mrs. William Avery, Mrs. William Addington, national committeewoman.
