Congressman Bob Dole (R-Kans) stated today that questionnaires have been mailed to residents in each of the 58 counties in his Congressional District. "The mailings were completed in most counties on March 31. More than 7,000 have been returned to my Washington office thus far," Dole said.

As questionnaires are returned, they are tabulated on a county-by-county basis, and it is hoped tabulations will be completed by May 15. Attached hereto is a breakdown of results in eight (8) selected counties, representing a total of <u>2154 returns</u>, ranging from:

It is impossible, of course, to be completely objective; however, this year the Government and Research Division of the Library of Congress assisted in preparation of the questionnaires.

Western Kansans feel very strongly, as indicated on the attached sheet, that: (1) "anti-poverty" funds should not be increased; (2) one House of a State Legislature should be apportioned considering factors other than population; (3) Section 14 (b) of the Taft-Hartley Act should not be repealed; (4) unemployment compensation programs should not be centralized and federalized.

"It is also interesting to note," Dole said, "that Western Kansan residents are almost evenly divided on four-year terms for members of the House of Representatives. Perhaps the greatest surprise, in my opinion, was the great number, over 80 percent, who feel that America's prestige in the world has declined since 1960 and the extremely high percentage who feel strongly against protest demonstrations with reference to our policy in Viet Nam. A great number of people write additional comments, and almost without exception, they make mention of the crisis in Viet Nam and express concern and confusion about our policies there. In the questionnaire itself, over 55 percent of those responding indicated dissatisfaction with Secretary of Defense, Robert S. McNamara's handling of the war in Viet Nam."

Dole stated, "I expect to receive a total of around 15,000 returns and encourage those who have not responded to do so."
