WASHINGTON - Rep. Bob Dole (R. Kans.) announced that June 5, 1967, is the deadline for young men interested to make application for entering service academies. Applicants must be single, between the ages of 17 and 22, as of July 1, 1968, and must reside in the area covered by the First Congressional District.

Dole said he has one vacancy to the United States Naval Academy, Annapolis, one to the United States Military Academy, West Point, two to the Air Force Academy, Colorado, and ten to the Merchant Marine Academy, Kings Point. Coast Guard Academy applicants must apply directly to the Commandant, U. S. Coast Guard, Washington, D. C., before December 1, 1967.

Applicants are required to take a Civil Service examination July 11, 1967, however, a make-up examination will be given August 22, 1967, for those candidates who cannot report for the July examination.

"Application forms should be obtained through my District Office located at 101 Federal Building, Great Bend," Dole said.
