Five projects totaling about \$40,000 in Federal assistance have been completed since the Land and Water Conservation Fund became operative in January, 1967. Total development costs (Federal, State, and local) would be in excess of \$80,000. These developments are a good start toward meeting the increased recreational needs of Western Kansans. Under the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act all projects must be in accord with an approved Comprehensive State-wide Plan for outdoor recreation. The Statewide plan was developed by the Kansas Park and Resources Authority in cooperation with the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation and approved by the Secretary of Interior.

The purpose of this program is to assist State and local governments in preserving, developing, and assuring accessibility to all citizens such quality and quantity of outdoor recreation resources as might be available. Project costs under the program are commonly divided between Federal and State and local governments on a 50/50 basis.

The Land and Water Conservation Fund is financed from revenues from the \$7.00 "Golden Passport" Federal Recreation Area permits and other fees, sale of surplus Federal property, and Federal motorboat fuel taxes.

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
