WASHINGTON, D.C., May 21 -- Congressman Bob Dole, who will give the high school commencement address in his hometown of Russell Friday, today received some pertinent advice from a graduating senior.

In a letter to the Congressman, Roger LaRue wrote, "You are going to be our commencement speaker, and I have one request to make."

"Please make it short."

"I don't mean so short as to not get your point across," LaRue added, "but after waiting 12 years for this event we are all chomping at the bit."

Congressman Dole, who was graduated in 1941 from Russell high, said the advice is sound and that he condensing his remarks.

Wishing Dole "all the luck in the world" in his Senate campaign, LaRue wrote, "I won't be able to vote. But I'll be making it possible for all Americans to vote."

LaRue, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter E. LaRue of Russell, has joined the Marine Reserve and will go on active duty later this month.
