OVERLAND, PARK, Kans., May 31 — Congressman Bob Dole, speaking at a political rally sponsored by the Johnson County Dole for Senate Committee here, tonight said he feels Congress will pass President Johnson's "surtax" proposal, since the President has now indicated that he will go along with the \$6 billion spending cut.

Dole said, "Because of our present fiscal crisis, this appears to be the only responsible course to follow."

Dole predicted that a majority of the responsible members of Congress would vote for the increase if it were coupled with the \$6 billion spending cut.

He added, "Strangely enough, some of the 'liberals' in Congress will vote against the tax increase. In my opinion, this is political hypocrisy, for certainly those who voted for all the 'spending' should be willing to vote to help 'pay the bill'."

Dole said, "A vote to increase taxes is not politically popular or desirable, but the possible alternatives are less desirable and could cause permanent damage to our nation's economy."

"It is unfortunate", he said, "that some Members have not had the courage to vote 'no' on some of the Great Society spending programs the past few years, for they in effect have caused the problem."
