WASHINGTON, D.C., Aug. 22 -- Congressman Bob Dole today announced an Air Force "flyover" has been arranged as part of Leo Hines Day Friday in Ellinwood.

The day's event commemorates the late Leo Hines, a World War I pilot from Ellinwood and other area airmen who served in World War I. Hines was trained at Payne air field in Mississippi where a 50th anniversary reunion of other World War I pilots will also be held Friday.

Dole, who coordinated the flyover with the Department of the Air Force here, said several B-57 planes from Forbestair base in Topeka will fly over the route of the parade, which begins at 10:15 a.m. in Ellinwood.

The planes which will appear in standard flight formation, he added, are the same type of light bombers currently used in Southeast Asia.
