WASHINGTON, D.C., Oct. 14 -- Congressman Bob Dole has received a "Watchdog of the Treasury" award from the National Associated Businessmen, Inc. for "his outstanding economy voting record" in the 90th Congress, 1967-68.

The trophy, a gold-color bulldog, is awarded to those Representatives and Senators who achieve a voting record of 75 percent or more, based on a NAB tabulation.

Dole is one of 189 Representatives who received a 100 percent economy rating. The NAB score is based on six issues voted on during the first session and six during the second session of the 90th Congress.

Presenting the award to Dole, NAB president John C. Mason said, "Your record indicates...you have a keen realization of the problems of fiscal responsibility. I know it takes a lot of courage to stand up against those who advocate unnecessary federal spending."

"Your voting record is a constructive achievement of which you and the voters who elected you to the U.S. Congress should be very proud," he added.

The NAB, a nonpartisan group composed primarily of small business firms, made a similar award to Dole in 1966.
