

WASHINGTON, D.C., Feb. 6 (AP) — U.S. Senator Bob Dole co-sponsored a bill this week to eliminate a major portion of the Ammunition Registration Section of the Gun Control Act of 1968.

Dole said the ammunition portion of the Gun Control Act, which became law last December, requires nine notations for each sale of ammunition. He added "The amount of information needed for each sale did not deter crime as much as it caused inconvenience to legitimate gun users."

Dole said that under this bill introduced by Wallace F. Bennett, (R-Utah), the definition of ammunition has been changed. The new definition in the bill reads.... "The term 'ammunition' shall include only ammunition for a destructive device and pistol or revolver ammunition. It shall not include shotgun shells, metallic ammunition suitable for use only in rifles, or any .22 caliber rimfire ammunition."
