STATEMENT OF SENATOR BOB DOLE ON THE DEATH OF FORMER
PRESIDENT DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER.

"The death of General Eisenhower is a great and personal sorrow for me, for Kansas, for the Nation, and for the entire world. We have lost a friend, leader and statesman who devoted his life to upholding and strengthening freedom and extending prosperity to all.

"He was not complacent, but committed; not derisive, but dedicated; not indifferent, but involved.

"We will prosper for having lived in the era of former President Eisenhower. We will suffer for having lost his leadership and his strength. His faith in America and her institutions shall be an inspiration to generations to follow."
