WASHINGTON, D.C., Nov. 5 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) should have spent the night at the White House ----- he had dinner with the President Nov. 4 and returned early today for breakfast.

Tuesday night Dole was a guest at President Nixon's dinner for Prince Philip. Over 100 guests attended the black-tie dinner for the visiting monarch.

Wednesday, the Kansas Senator returned to the White House with 18 other Senators and Congressmen for breakfast with the President. The 18, often called "the Nixon originals", organized in 1968 to work for the election of Richard Nixon to the Presidency. Today's breakfast celebrated the first anniversary of Nixon's election.

Attending the breakfast were Senators Mundt (S.D.), Curtis (Neb.), Cotton, (N.H.), Murphy (Calif.), Hruska (Neb.), Baker (Tenn.), Tower (Tex.), Hansen (Wy.), Boggs (Del.), and Dole and Congressmen Arends (Ill.), Brock (Tenn), MacGregor (Minn.), Lipscomb (Calif.), Fulton (Pa.), Bow (Ohio), Ford (Mich.), Wyman (N.H.), and Morton (Md.). Also attending were Bryce Harlow, Counselor to the President, and Attorney General John Mitchell.
