DES MOINES, IOWA, NOV. 14---Urging citizens to stand up for their President, U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) said that while most people support him, there is a "definite effort by some to sandbag President Nixon on Vietnam."

Dole spoke before the Midwest Republican Conference here today.

"Some are trying to pressure the President into one course of action or another," Dole said, "but at the same time they are maneuvering for positions so that no matter what course he takes, they will be able to say 'I told you so.'"

"If these few have their way, the President is doomed if he does and doomed if he doesn't in Vietnam."

"We can stand up for him in the Senate, but you must stand up for him in the supermarket, at the PTA meetings and at the football games."
