WASHINGTON, D. C. Aug. 8 --U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) today made available TV and radio tapes expressing his views on recent "Amendment to End the War" commercials sponsored by Senator Mark Hatfield (R-Oreg.) and Senator George McGovern (D-S.Dak.).

Dole termed the "Amendment to End the War" the "Amendment to Lose the Peace" and urged Americans to disregard the paid TV commercials.

Dole continues, "All Americans want peace. President Nixon wants peace. Most Senators want peace, but peace with honor, not surrender. President Nixon is winning the peace -- he has a plan for peace. He has the support of most Senators. I trust he can count on your support during this critical time."

The 30 and 60 second spots are available by request to the Senator's office. Over 30 radio and TV stations have already requested copies and will begin airing them immediately.

TRANSCRIPT OF MATERIAL TO BE SENT TO
TELEVISION AND RADIO STATIONS

60 Seconds -----

I am Senator Bob Dole. You may have recently seen slick Madison Avenue commercials urging you to support the so-called "Amendment to End the War," which I designate the "Amendment to Lose the Peace." Its principal sponsors, Senator Hatfield and Senator McGovern are urging Congress to pass a law which would turn over to the Communist enemy the country of South Vietnam, a country the Communists could not take by force. Most Senators believe this is wrong. Most Senators believe this is not peace, but surrender. Most Senators believe we should not let 50,000 Americans have died in vain. Most Senators support President Nixon in his working plan for peace. President Nixon is winning the peace. Soon the United States Senate will debate what I call "The Lose the Peace Amendment." Most Senators and most Americans support President Nixon. I trust he can count on your support during this critical time.

30 Seconds -----

I am Senator Bob Dole. Soon the Senate will begin debate on the so-called "Amendment to End the War," which I believe should be designated the "Amendment to Lose the Peace." All Americans want peace. President Nixon wants peace. Most Senators want peace, but peace with honor, not surrender.
