WASHINGTON, D.C., Oct. 7, 1970 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole tonight termed President Nixon's message a "bold new initiative for peace" and strongly urged all parties in Indochina to begin the stand-still cease-fire.

Dole also urged immediate release of all prisoners of war on both sides accompanied by increased troop withdrawals.

The Kansas Senator telephoned President Nixon immediately after his address to express his hopes that the North Vietnamese would make an active effort toward peace in Indochina and comply with the President's new proposals.
