WASHINGTON, D.C., NOV. 7, 1970 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) made a statement today on National employment.

Dole said, "The stabilization of the Nation's employment picture as shown by Department of Labor statistics released Friday is welcome news to all Americans.

"I suspect this even includes those leaders of the National Democratic Party, who used phony predictions of a big increase in unemployment to frighten voters just before last Tuesday's elections.

"The 5.6 jobless rate indicates that the Nixon Administration is stabilizing both unemployment and inflation. It is not only regrettable but also dishonest that the Democratic leadership chose to dream up spurious figures and publicize them in advance of the elections.

"The politics of fear have been used constantly by Democratic National Chairman Lawrence O'Brien and his cohorts during the last year. I am hopeful the American people will not be fooled by such tactics in the future."
