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WASHINGTON, D.C. Nov. 14 -- U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) predicted yesterday that the post-election session of Congress will accomplish little because 1974 Democrat Presidential hopefuls will be jockeying for position.

"It appears," Dole said, "crucial legislation may be shunted aside for daily displays of political footwork by Democrat "hopefuls."

"Over one dozen major bills and seven appropriations measures are awaiting action.

"The agriculture bill, welfare reform, the SST, consumer protection bills and appropriations for the financially-strangled District of Columbia and others have waited far too long for Senate action.

"I hope the Senate will conduct the important business during this "lame duck" session in the most expedient manner possible and then adjourn."
