WASHINGTON, D.C., NOV. 28, 1970 -- Woody Hayes, head football coach at Ohio State University, will be President Richard Nixon's personal representative at the "Night of Stars" benefit performance this evening at Wichita State University.

U.S. Senator Bob Dole (R-Kans.) will accompany Hayes to Wichita where the coach will read a message from the President.

All proceeds will be used to meet the needs of the survivors of the Wichita State and Marshall University Air crashes.
