WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 9, 1971 --- U.S. Sen. Bob Dole (R-Kans.)

said today that the President's economic program will help Kansas businesses, farms and the state's working men.

In a statement on the Senate floor Dole said:

The programs urged by the President will be of great benefit to Kansas, a state that has strongly felt the impact brought about by the change from a wartime to a peacetime economy.

The President's programs will help businesses in Kansas by strengthening their competitive position against foreign goods and by offering incentives to invest in new machinery and equipment.

These programs will also help the working man in Kansas by increasing the personal income tax exemption, by creating more jobs and by ending runaway inflation. This last point is especially crucial to the farmers in Kansas, who for many years have borne a heavy share of inflation's cruel burden.

The people of Kansas responded to the announcement of the new economic policy with overwhelming approval, and I believe they will continue to support the President in his efforts to achieve a generation of peace and prosperity and without inflation.
