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WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 21, 1971---U.S. Senators James B. Pearson and Bob Dole, Kansas Republicans announced today a \$48,766 federal grant to the Menniger Foundation in Topeka.

The grant, from the National Institute of Mental Health, is to fund the first year of a two-year research study to determine if people can learn to produce brain waves associated with creativity.

The Kansas Senators explained that a number of U.S. scientists are becoming interested in the achievement of voluntary control over body processes, and the project announced today, reflects that growing interest. The project, directed by Dr. Elmer Green, will study the proposal that people can become more creative by "learning" how to facilitate the production of brain wave patterns that are thought to be associated with daydreaming and imagery.

The title of the project is, "Alpha, - Theta Brain Wave Feedback, Reverie and Imagery."
