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NEWS from U.S. Senator Bob Dole

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A 115-mile geodetic survey is being conducted along Interstate Highway 35 and U. S. Highway in Kansas, Senators James Pearson and Bob Dole announced today.

The \$84,000 survey will be completed in June by the National Geodetic Survey of NOAA's National Ocean Survey. Routes being surveyed extend from McPherson through Newton to Wichita on I-35 and from Hutchinson through Newton to Florence on U. S. 50, in the counties of Marion, Reno, Harvey and Sedgwick.

The five-county project is being carried out for the Kansas State Highway Commission. Over 90 geographic positions will be established for use in highway planning. The project is designed for 80 positions along I-35 and 10 positions along U. S. 50. The control points will enable engineers to plan the alignment of highways with a high degree

of accuracy. The survey will be conducted using data from aerial photographs.
