WASHINGTON, D.C., JUNE 13, 1972 -- Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced today of seven summer projects of the Neighborhood Youth Corps (NYC) in Kansas.

The Kansas Senators said the NYC projects will provide summer jobs and much needed cash to 1,556 young people from low-income families. The Labor Department has allocated \$666,410 for the project.

The Kansas Senators said NYC youngsters may be assigned to private non-profit or public agencies, for a total of 234 hours. Normally that will be nine weeks of 26 hours each. The young people are paid \$1.60 an hour.

Summer NYC projects announced are:

El Dorado - Mid-Kansas Community Action Program,

Inc. 60 enrollees, \$25,970.

Horton - North East Kansas Community Action Program,

Inc. 123 enrollees \$53,140

Junction City - St. Xavier's School. 149 enrollees \$64,450

Kansas City - Unified School District 500, 383 enrollees, \$165,460.
