WASHINGTON, D.C., JUNE 29, 1972 -- The Senate today passed the Dole-Randolph Voter Registration Resolution calling for September, 1972, to be designated as "National Voter Registration Month."

Senator Dole said, "Senate passage of this resolution puts Congress on record as a full-spirited participant in the campaign to expand the voter polls and thereby the people's part in securing the sound and wise functioning of government in America."

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
That in recognition of the importance of Congress promotion and encouragement of voter registration by all qualified citizens, especially those newly enfranchised by the twenty sixth amendment to the Constitution, the President is authorized and directed to proclaim the period beginning September 1, 1972, and ending September 30, 1972, as "National Voter Registration Month," and to call upon the people of the United States to observe such month with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
