WASHINGTON, D.C., AUGUST 2, 1972 -- Senator Bob Dole said today that Democrats in Kansas must stand or fall with their Presidential candidate, George McGovern, this November.

"The Primary results clearly indicate the Republican nominee for Governor, Morris Kay, and the nominee for Congress from the Second District, Charles McAtee, will be running with President Nixon. It is also clear that Governor Docking and Congressman Roy will try to have it both ways, and will probably attempt to play down some of McGovern's radical policies and programs."

Senator Dole predicted Kansas voters -- Republican, Democrats and independant alike -- will see through this smokescreen and that the great majority will demonstrate their confidence in President Nixon by electing Morris Kay Governor and Charles McAtee Congressman.
