WASHINGTON, D.C., DEC. 7, 1972 -- Senator Bob Dole announced today that more than \$25 million in revenue sharing funds in checks will be mailed to Kansas tomorrow.

The state government will receive \$8,653,771 with \$17,307,000 going to the various cities, counties and townships across Kansas.

The funds are the first released under the General Revenue Sharing program enacted by Congress earlier this year and represent the first half of the state's 1972 entitlement.

Senator Dole, an original co-sponsor of the Revenue Sharing legislation said, "Revenue Sharing is the most important and far-reaching government program to be initiated in recent years. But it is only a part of a more comprehensive plan which includes special revenue sharing and government reorganization. The long range goal of these programs is to return the resources and powers of government to the people who are most closely involved in the day-to-day business of dealing with our chief domestic problems."
