WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Representatives of Kansas' meat, poultry, and oil industries met today in the office of Senator Bob Dole to present their views of the economic needs of their industries to Dr. John Dunlop, director of the Cost of Living Council.

The meeting attended by Dole, Dunlop and Kansas Congressmen Shriver, Skubitz and Sebelius, was arranged by Dole to ensure that the views of these Kansas representatives could be heard and considered before the announcement of Phase IV economic control regulations, expected sometime later this week.

Dole said he had asked for the meeting "so the Dunlop could get first-hand information from men in business in Kansas who will have to operate under Phase IV rules."
