HOLTON, KANSAS -- Speaking at a Freedom Tree Dedication in Holton, Senator Bob Dole told the audience of MIA families and friends that he plans to cosponsor a resolution to make certain that MIA's are not forgotten.

"MIA's cannot be forgotten anywhere, least of all can they be forgotten by the Congress, or by any who take part in setting our national policy, Dole said. "That is why I am cosponsoring a resolution that would prohibit any trade, aid, or any form of increased communication with the Communists in North Vietnam until a full accounting of our Missing-In-Action has been received, as agreed to in the Paris Cease-fire agreements."

Dole attended the tree planting ceremony where six trees were planted as a symbolic commitment to Kansans missing in action.
