FRIBLEY NOMINATION APPROVED BY SENATE

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Senator Bob Dole announced that the Senate today approved President's Nixon's nomination of Bill Fribley to be Federal Co-chairman of the Ozarks Regional Commission.

Dole said that Mr. Fribley's 21 years in the Kansas Legislature have provided him with a unique perspective from which to assess the problems, needs, and opportunities being faced by state governments.

"The Ozarks Regional Commission seeks to harmonize federal and state economic development efforts," Dole said, "and certainly his service for four years as special assistant to the former federal cochairman, has given him the fullest possible familiarity with the Commission's programs and goals."

"I believe Mr. Fribley will provide the necessary leadership and will direct the Commission with ability, understanding and the same high degree of competence which he has demonstrated throughout his career of public service," Dole added.
