\$240,509 LABOR DEPT. GRANT TO MANPOWER PROGRAM FOR HISPANIC AMERICANS

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Senator Bob Dole today announced the awarding of \$240,509 from the Department of Labor to the SER program in Kansas.

SER supplies a variety of services aimed primarily at Hispanic Americans, and is administered by Jobs for Progress, Inc., in Topeka. Jobs for Progress is an organization cosponsored by the G.I. Forum and the League of Latin American Citizens.

"About 160 enrollees will be selected during the year for basic education, job preparation, counseling, and skill training to help them get and hold jobs. Some of these will receive services through a new satellite project in Garden City," Dole said.

Throughout Fiscal Year 1973 SER ranked first among the Department of Labor's various manpower programs in four major areas: (1) lowest cost per placement, (2) lowest dropout rate, (3) a 78% record of placing trainees in jobs, and (4) a retention rate of over 86%.
