WASHINGTON, D.C. - Senator Bob Dole announced today he had recommended that the President appoint Mr. Charles Stuart of Clay Center, Kansas, to a newly created position on the National Advisory Council for the School Lunch Program and Child Nutrition.

Having served as Superintendent of Clay Center Public Schools for six years and of Clay County Unified School District for seven, Mr. Stuart is well qualified for the position which requires experience as a rural school food service supervisor. Mr. Stuart was closely involved in expanding the school lunch program in Clay Center. A graduate of Kansas State Teachers College and Kansas State University, he has a broad knowledge of food service needs through his experience as past President of the Kansas Association of School Administrators and as first President of the United School Administrators of Kansas.

"Mr. Stuart seems eminently qualified for the position," Senator Dole said, "and I am sure he could represent Kansas and rural food service needs in an excellent manner." The Department of Agriculture is currently reviewing the recommendation.
