CABIN ON NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson announced today that the Christian Wetzel cabin has been entered in the National Register of Historic Places. The cabin is a log structure that was built in 1857. It is now maintained as a museum by the Kansas Luthern Historical Society and is located in a roadside park on Interstate 70 just east of Junction City.

The National Register comes under the authority of the Secretary of the Interior through the National Park Service. It is the official listing of the nation's cultural property worthy of preservation for their historic value.
