THERE IS GREAT CONCERN IN AMERICA AS WE FACE THE PROSPECT OF SERIOUS FUEL SHORTAGES AT HOME ~~IN THE WEEKS AND MONTHS AHEAD~~. HOUSES MUST BE HEATED AND INDUSTRIES MUST BE KEPT RUNNING. BUT MANY ARE WORRIED THAT THE SHORTAGES MAY BE MADE WORSE BY LARGE QUANTITIES OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS BEING SHIPPED ABROAD.

OUR TRADE RELATIONSHIPS ARE IMPORTANT, AND COMPLEX, BUT IN LIGHT OF THE ENERGY EMERGENCY THEY SHOULD BE RE-EXAMINED TO ASSURE THAT OUR CITIZENS ARE GIVEN EVERY POSSIBLE ASSURANCE OF ADEQUATE FUEL AND PETOLEUM SUPPLIES.
