GENERAL AVIATION FUEL ALLOCATIONS PLAN MODIFIED

WASHINGTON, D. C. The following is a statement released by Senator Bob Dole today from his Washington office:

"I have just had a call from President Nixon who told me of his decision to increase the fuel allocations for general aviation over those which he had announced last week.

"The President said he had personally reviewed the cut-back plan at my request and the request of Congressman Garner Shriver. We had told him of the severe economic hardships Wichita and other Kansas areas were encountering.

"The new allocation figures for general aviation which the President decided upon are a 15 percent cut -- instead of 20 percent -- for high priority uses like agricultural spraying, air taxi services and industrial needs; a 25 percent cut for business uses instead of the 40 percent cut which had been announced; and a 35 percent cut for personal and pleasure flying instead of the originally announced 50 percent cut-back.

"The President said he was hopeful that these adjustments would help ease the economic problems of Kansas, and I thanked him for Congressman Shriver and myself and for the people of Kansas."

GENERAL AVIATION FUEL ALLOCATIONS PLAN MODIFIED
