TOPEKA RECEIVES ALLOCATION AND GRANT

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole and James Pearson today announced a \$118,004 allocation to Topeka from the Department of Labor. The money is allocated under Title II of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act at the Administration's Fiscal 1975 request level.

The aim of Title II is to give the unemployed transitional public service employment in areas of substantial unemployment. It will fund 1,617 jobs in any public agency, such as schools, hospitals, libraries, or public works, recreations, police and fire departments.

The two Kansas Senators also announced a \$22,083 Legal Services grant to the Legal Aid Society of Topeka, Inc. from the Office of Economic Opportunity. The funds will be used to provide legal services, counseling and representation at the trial and appellate levels as well as before administrative agencies.
