KANSAN JOINS AGRICULTURE COMMITTEE STAFF

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Roy Frederick of Manhattan, Kansas has joined the professional staff of the Senate Agriculture and Forestry Committee, Senator Bob Dole announced.

Frederick, 31, was Assistant Professor of Economics (Extension) at Kansas State University from 1971 until joining the Committee staff this week. He received his B.S. in 1966 and M.S. in 1968, both in Agricultural Economics from the University of Nebraska. In 1971, Frederick received his Ph.D. from Purdue University in Agricultural Economics.

In his position with Kansas State University, Frederick developed educational materials and authored numerous publications for the K.S.U. Cooperative Extension Service. He also gave approximately 100 talks across the State each year.

Dole said that in his role with the Agriculture Committee, Frederick would be involved with a full range of agricultural legislation. "His background in agricultural economics and familiarity with agriculture in Kansas make him a very valuable addition to the staff," Dole added.
