CAMPAIGN FUNDS TRANSFERRED TO OFFICE ACCOUNT

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- Senator Bob Dole announced today the termination of the Kansans for Senator Dole Committee. He said the \$4,143.05 remaining in his 1974 campaign account is being transferred to a Senate office account. The office account will be utilized in accordance with Senate rules to help improve Senate office services to Kansans.

Dole emphasized that the account would be operated in strict compliance with Senate rule 42 and Federal Election Commission regulations. Revenues and expenditures will be recorded and approved by a Lawrence, Kansas, Certified Public Accountant, who will publish, in the Congressional Record, a semi-annual report on the office account. Contributions to the account will be limited to a maximum of \$250. per person per calendar year. Contributions from corporations and labor unions are prohibited.

Rule 42 of the Standing Rules of the Senate authorizes the use of office account funds to "defray expenses for travel to and from each Senator's home state, for printing and other expenses in connection with the mailing of speeches, newsletters, and reports to a Senator's constituents, for expenses of radio, television, and news media methods of reporting to a Senator's constituents, for telephone, telegraph, postage, and stationary expenses in excess of allowance, and for newspaper subscriptions from his home state." Rules of the office account will specifically prohibit the use of these funds for any partisan political purpose.
