MEETING ON GRAIN INSPECTION BRINGS NO COMPROMISE

WASHINGTON, D.C.--Senators Bob Dole, Hubert Humphrey, and Dick Clark and Chairman Thomas Foley of the House Agriculture Committee met informally yesterday in an attempt to iron out their differences on the grain inspection bill. The House-Senate Conference Committee on the grain inspection bill has postponed further meetings until an agreement could be worked out.

Dole said that although no compromise was reached in the meeting yesterday, all four agreed to discuss possible compromise proposals with other colleagues. The Kansas Senator added that Senator Clark had put forth a new proposal at the meeting. Dole said that while he was not at liberty to reveal the details, he disagreed with several provisions of the proposal and did "not consider it a viable compromise."
