## DOLE MEETS WITH PROPOSITION 13's HOWARD JARVIS

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Sen. Bob Dole (R-Kan.) and Sen. S.I. Hayakawa (R-Calif.) today were the hosts of a breakfast for Howard Jarvis, the originator of California's Proposition 13 property tax cut initiative.

The breakfast, held in a room in the Capitol, enabled Jarvis to meet with Dole and 11 other senators. Following breakfast, Dole and Jarvis participated in a 20-minute press conference.

The senators attending were: Dole, Hayakawa, Curtis (R-Neb.), Roth (R-Del.),
Hatch (R-Utah), Lugar (R-Ind.), St (R-Alaska), Garn (R-Utah), Schweik er (R-Pa.),
Wallop (R-Wyo.), Hansen (R-Wyo.) and Harry Byrd (I-Va.).

Dole described the breakfast as "low-key," and said it was mainly to acquaint

Jarvis and the senators with each other. "At least now we know who he is and he knows who we are." Dole said.

The breakfast conversation centered on the history of Proposition 13 in California, and the organization of the Jarvis-Gann committee.

Sen. Dole has been a key Senate figure in promoting a federal balanced budget, and eliminating new taxes caused by inflation.
