DOLE ENCOURAGED BY CAMP DAVID OUTCOME

WASHINGTON -- Following is a statement by Sen. Bob Dole (R-Kan.) on the conclusion of the Camp David summit meeting:

"I think there is every reason to be pleased with the outcome of the Camp David talks. I also think we have to be cautious, however. As I have said repeatedly, the road to peace in the Middle East lies between Jerusalem and Cairo, and that road appears to have been opened. If it remains open, there will be peace, simply because there can be no war without Egyptian participation.

"As for the West Bank, we have to wait and see what King Hussein does, and we have to see what the PLO will do to prevent peace. The future there depends on them, and not on U.N. troops or any other outside forces."
