## DOLE MEETS WITH DETROIT MAYOR COLEMAN YOUNG, DISCUSSING ECONOMIC PROBLEMS

DETROIT -- Senator Bob Dole (R.-Kansas) met today with Detroit Mayor Coleman Young at the Detroit City Hall.

Dole, ranking Republican on the Senate Finance Committee and Chairman of Ronald Reagan's Legislative Advisory Committee on Economic Issues, discussed the economic problems of urban areas with the Detroit mayor.

Dole said of the meeting, "We had a wide-ranging and frank exchange, and I assured the Mayor that the Republican Party will continue its commitment to complete the revitalization of America's urban areas. I also told Mayor Young that farm state representatives are increasingly aware of the economic plight of the cities. Farm areas are facing similar severe economic conditions as the result of an agricultural depreciation caused by drought and Carter Administration policies."

Joining Dole in the half-hour meeting was Senator Roger Jepsen (R.-Iowa), a member of the Joint Economic Committee.

Dole is currently planning to meet Tuesday with leaders of the Auto Industry and Wednesday with Labor leaders in Detroit.
