SENATOR DOLE HAS RETURNED \$365,922.05 TO TREASURY SINCE 1975

WASHINGTON-- Figures released today indicate that Senator Bob Dole (R.-Kansas) returned \$44,298.46 in payroll allowance funds to the U.S. Treasury in fiscal year 1980, which ended September 30th.

U.S. Senate offices are funded based on the population of the state the individual Senator represents. There are two kinds of Senate accounts-- payroll and consolidated allowance. Consolidated allowance includes payments for such items as stationary, office supplies, long distance telephone calls, travel to and from Kansas, Kansas office expenses and newspaper and periodical subscriptions.

The consolidated allowance figures are compiled on an annual basis. The 1980 figures will not be available until January, 1981.

However, even without the 1980 consolidated allowance figured in, Senator Dole has returned \$365,922.05 to the federal treasury since 1975. This includes \$282,487.36 in payroll funds and \$83,434.69 from the consolidated account.
