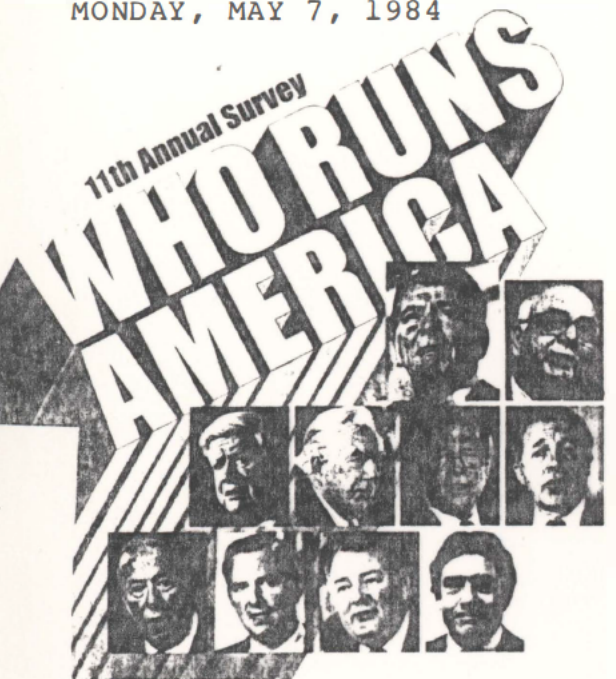

WASHINGTON -- Kansas Senator Bob Dole is the 19th most influential American according to a nationwide poll conducted by U.S. News & World Report magazine.

In its 11th annual "Who Runs America" survey, the Kansas Republican from Russell was also named as the 2nd most influential U.S. Senator, finishing only behind Senate Majority Leader Howard Baker.

The news magazine conducts its prestigious survey by America's top executives, opinion makers and other prominent leaders in 29 fields across the country.

According to the movers and shakers questioned by the magazine, Dole ranked higher in the "most influential American" category than Henry Kissinger, Ted Kennedy, Billy Graham and Jerry Falwell and Nancy Reagan.
