KANSAS SENATORS ANNOUNCE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY GRANTS FOR STATE

WASHINGTON -- Kansas Senators Bob Dole and Nancy Kassebaum today announced the following Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) grants:

LAWRENCE \$3,241,700
Construction of Wakarusa Relief Interceptor System
and Wakarusa Pumping Expansion

STATE OF KANSAS 883,000
Construction Management Assistance, Compliance
Monitoring, Water Quality Planning, Compliance
Inspection

GREENSBURG 489,980
Construction of a pump station, force main, treatment
storage lagoon system, irrigation pumping facilities,
appurtenances, purchase of approximately 36 acres
of land and an allowance for design services

FOWLER 376,700
Construction of a non-overflowing three-cell wastewater
treatment lagoon system with land application of stored
water, purchase of approximately 6.6 acres of land and
an allowance for design

TOPEKA 1,034,990
Construction of improvements to Oakland wastewater
treatment plant

PAOLA 1,015,240
Construction of approximately 1,300 linear feet of
interceptor, new main pump station, new force main,
rehabilitation of five creek crossings and allowance
for design services

CEDAR VALE 92,070
Construction of a third cell to the existing two-cell
stabilization lagoon system, the addition of erosion
protection to existing lagoons and an allowance for
design services

KANSAS CITY 694,370
Construction of the New Jersey Creek Interceptor which
eliminates the existing and adds additional capacity
for future growth and to transport and treat infil-
tration inflow

KANSAS CITY 1,650,990
Construction of the Rosedale Main No. Interceptor
improvements including removal of curb inlets through
construction of storm sewers, sliplining and parallel-
ing the existing Rosedale Main No. 1, manhole repairs
and spot sewer line repairs
